First reading: 2 Samuel 5:1-3

'They anointed David king over Israel.'

In those days: All the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron and said, 'Behold, we are your bone and flesh. In times past, when Saul was king over us, it was you who led out and brought in Israel. And the Lord said to you, "You shall be shepherd of my people Israel, and you shall be prince over Israel." ' So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron, and King David made a covenant with them at Hebron before the Lord, and they anointed David king over Israel.

Response: Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

Second Reading: Colossians 1:12-20

'He has transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son.'

Brothers and Sisters: Let us give thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in light. He has delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities — all things were created through him and for him. And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the Church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be pre-eminent. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.

Alleluia, alleluia.

Gospel Reading: Luke 23:35-43

'Lord, remember me when you come into your kingdom.'

At that time: The rulers scoffed at Jesus, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!' The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!' There was also an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals who were hanged there railed at Jesus, saying, 'Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!' But the other rebuked him, saying, 'Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed justly, for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong.' And he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.' And he said to him, 'Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise.'

REFLECTION

Today is the last Sunday in the church year; we have, once again, come full circle and now we prepare to begin again that journey with Jesus from birth, through death to eternal life. We come to this day, every year, changed by the passage of time. But whatever has befallen us in the past twelve months we must not lose sight of what really matters. Today's passage from Luke reminds us of the virtues that will carry us through the coming year: faith, hope and repentance. The cross is a sign of God's love for us, let us hold onto that love as we face the coming year.

Luke brings together, today, a collection of characters to represent the world in miniature. He skillfully blends the unspoken thoughts, the uttered words, and the dialogue between those crucified and those who stand and watch, until we can almost feel the atmosphere and become witnesses, in our time, to the timeless scene on the hill of Calvary.

We stand there, with the people, watching Jesus; we are captured in the scene as silent onlookers, unable to affect the events unfolding before our eyes. We are held between Hell and Heaven; this is our future, our relationship with God, that is being played out before us, and we are powerless to intervene. The rulers mock Him; "He saved others let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the chosen one" they speak for the world; that doubting, sneering, unbelieving world in which we live each day; the voice of hate disguised by the carefully crafted words of insincerity which seem so plausible but twist our faith in God into something which is mistaken, almost pagan.

"The soldiers also mocked him", the power is held in the hands of those who rule, who govern, who seek to impose their will on the people. The Roman Empire represents all those whose misuse of power effects the lives of millions of our brothers and sisters throughout the world. How painful can it be to imagine that Jesus must spend his final moments of life between two criminals; one speaks in the devil's temptation whisper "Save yourself and us", the other echoes our silent prayer "Jesus, Remember me when you come into your kingdom" Jesus speaks, and we hear those final words of love and consolation "Truly I say you, today you will be with me in paradise."

Help me to be your good servant!*


