This Sundays Readings

1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First reading: **Isaiah 2:1-5**

The Lord gathers all nations together into the eternal peace of the Kingdom of God.

The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

It shall come to pass in the latter days
that the mountain of the house of the Lord
shall be established as the highest of the mountains,
and shall be lifted up above the hills;
and all the nations shall flow to it,
and many peoples shall come, and say:
'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord,
to the house of the God of Jacob,
that he may teach us his ways
and that we may walk in his paths.'
For out of Sion shall go forth the law,
and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem.
He shall judge between the nations,
and shall decide disputes for many peoples;
and they shall beat their swords into ploughshares,
and their spears into pruning-hooks;
nation shall not lift up sword against nation,
neither shall they learn war any more.
O house of Jacob,
come, let us walk
in the light of the Lord.

Response: Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

Second Reading: **Romans 13:11-14a**

'Salvation is nearer to us now.'

Brothers and sisters: You know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armour of light. Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarrelling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia.
Show us, O Lord, your mercy,
and grant us your salvation.
Alleluia.

Gospel Reading: **Matthew 24:37-44**

Stay awake so that you may be ready.

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples: 'For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two men will be in the field; one will be taken and one left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken and one left. Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

REFLECTION

How often have you spent time waiting for something to happen and when it does, or doesn't, you feel a great sense of disappointment. Waiting can be a waste of time. We seem to spend our lives waiting; waiting to be born, to go to school, to start work, to retire, and, while we are waiting, our lives go on, in joy and sorrow, and the waiting never stops. Advent is about waiting, but when we wait in Advent we wait with purpose, Advent is a time of anticipation, of longing, of hope. Each Advent our thoughts turn to the coming of the Lord. The Feast of Christmas and the birth of the Christ Child grow ever closer, but so too, at lifetimes own pace, the coming of the Risen Christ at the end of time.

We begin the season of Advent with three passages, many years apart. The readings reflect the faith of the people at the time the events they speak of were taking place. Isaiah speaks of a vision of the latter days; he speaks of the House of God standing on a high mountain, and of all the nations flowing towards it. A God who will teach all people His ways, "so that we may walk in his paths". His vision is of a God of Peace who will bring justice and security to the nations of the world.

Paul senses the immediacy of the day of the Lord. He looked back to Isaiah and saw the world in a different light; after all, if Jesus was the Messiah, and Paul certainly believed he was, then all was fulfilled and all he waited for was the second coming in glory. So, he urges the people, be patient in your waiting, be ready, don't lose it all now after all we have been through, keep going. "Put on the Lord Jesus Christ".

The Apostles were waiting; their impatience showed at times. When Lord? Was often on their lips, when the Kingdom? when the glory? when will we be free? Jesus tells them; be ready, always be ready; "Stay awake for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming". This idea that we should always be ready is good advice because our lives are fragile; we do not know when this life will come to an end.


